After 15 stages, the similar car of Mark Jasper/Don Whyatt was second while Tony Davies/Patrick Walsh (Subaru Impreza WRC), who had been leading prior to a problem on the final stage, were third. Event sponsor and defending National Asphalt Champion, John Price was fourth in his 'spare' Metro 6R4 as his front-line car is awaiting the return of its engine from a rebuild.

MSA BRITISH SPORTING TRIAL CHAMPIONSHIP

The first round in the Championship, the Geoff Taylor - Hagley & District Light Car Club event, attracted 38 competitors to contest thirty sections on a fine and dry February day at the Hurtle Hill site, Heightington, near Stourport-on-Severn. 2005 Champion Julian Fack was one of just two retirements. Ian Wright (Sherpa) took maximum championship points, losing just five marks on the day, from John Fack (Crosslé) on seven marks and Paul Faulkner (Sherpa) on 13.
