Herts County Auto & Aero Club is proud to present the second of our three sprints to be held this year at Debden airfield, which is part of Carver Barracks, home of the 33 Engineer Regiment (Explosive Ordnance Disposal).

The course is over a mile long with interesting and fairly fast left and right bends.

The airfield where our course is situated, is separated by a security fence from Carver Barracks. We have no access to the Barracks. Everybody attending will need a special entry ticket, provided by the club, and must come in by the marked gateway as sign-posted on the day. This is a *different* entrance from the main entrance to Carver Barracks.

Please note that overnight camping is not permitted

SPECIAL NOTICE

The Debden Sprint Circuit is at risk of losing its Motor Sports use licence. Complaints of noise nuisance have been made to Uttlesford D.C. The problem has been caused by a combination of a number of different events such as Stage Rallies, Karting, as well as the Sprints run by H.C.A & A.C.

We have managed to negotiate with the Environmental Health Dept. of Uttlesford D.C. the use of the venue for sprint events. However, we have had to concede on a number of matters as follows:

1. No competitor should attempt to arrive before 07.30 a.m.
1. Modified cars and Racing cars shall not start or run engines before 09.30 a.m.
2. Timed practice will not start before 09.30 a.m.
3. No tyre warming will be permitted.
4. A 45 min. lunch break shall be provided between timed practice and the timed runs.
5. The timed runs must be complete by 17.30 p.m.

See Section 10 of these supplementary regulations for details of the noise limits. Competitors co-operation with the above is essential if we are to retain the use of this venue. Please help us to provide you with a much enjoyed circuit.

Dogs and spectators are not permitted at this meeting.

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SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

1. Herts County Auto & Aero Club will organise a National (B) Permit Sprint meeting on Sunday, 13th July 2008 at Debden Airfield (MR: 154/TL567344), Wimbish, Saffron Walden, Essex.
2. The meeting will be held under the General Regulations of the MSA Limited (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting code of the FIA), these supplementary regulations, and any other written instructions that the organisers may issue for the event.
3. MSA Permit No: **46268**
4. The event is open to all fully elected members of the organising club, registered contenders in the ACSMC, AEMC, ASEMC Sprint championships and members of the following invited clubs:
BARC, Borough 19 MC, Green Belt MC, Hillclimb & Sprint Association, Peterborough M.C., Harrow C.C., Tunbridge Wells M.C., TVR Owners Club, Sevenoaks & District M.C., Woolbridge M.C., RSSOC, West Essex M.C., Ginetta Owners Club, Austin Healey Club, Morgan Sports Car Club.
5. The event is a round of the following sprint championships:
 - ACSMC Sprint Championship
 - AEMC Sprint Championship
 - ASEMC Sprint Championship
 - Borough 19 championship
6. Licences: All entrants and drivers must produce a valid National (B) or higher status MSA competition licence, club membership card and championship registration card as appropriate.
MSA Speed National A [OPEN] or National A Race licences are required to be held by drivers of Sports Libre Cars and Single Seater Racing Cars if over 2000cc in accordance with **I.20**. Sports Libre cars include Special Saloons and Sports Racing cars as in **I.123**.
7. The timetable for the meeting will be:
 - Signing on & Scrutineering commences at 07:45 a.m.
 - Drivers briefing 09:15 a.m.
 - Practice runs will commence at 09:30 a.m.
 - Signing on closes at 09:30 a.m.
 - Competition runs will start as soon as possible after the completion of practice.

8. Classes will be as follows:

Category A: Standard Production Cars
(Excluding 4WD and Category C Kit Type Cars and Replicas)

0. Up to 2000cc

Category B: Road Going Saloon and Sports Cars
(Excluding Kit Type Cars and Replicas).

1. Up to 1400cc
2. 1401 to 2000cc
3. 2001cc and over

Category C: Road Going Kit Type Cars and Replica Cars
(Including Lotus 7, Elise, Exige, Vauxhall VX220 and derivatives of these cars, Sylva, Caterham and Westfield cars)

4. Up to 1700cc
5. 1701 cc and over

Category D: Modified Production Sports and Saloon Cars
(Excluding Kit Type Cars and Replicas, Lotus 7, Elise, Exige, Vauxhall VX 220 and derivatives of these cars, Sylva, Caterham and Westfield cars)

6. Up to 1400cc
7. 1401 to 2000cc
8. 2001cc and over

Category E: Single Seater and Sports Libre Cars.

9. Special Saloons, Group B and GT1 Sports Cars, World Rally Cars, Kit Type Cars and Replicas, of any capacity, not complying with any other class.
10. Single Seater and Sports Racing Cars up to 1500cc
11. Single Seater and Sports Racing Cars 1501cc and over

In the event of more than 6 entries further Marque classes may be formed at the Organiser's discretion. These will be listed in the Final Instructions.

(N.B. MSA Blue Book section **C(c)** is not negated by these regulations).

CARS USING FORCED INDUCTION: These cars will be classified as having an engine capacity increase of 40%; those using diesel fuel a reduction of 50%, e.g. a 2000cc turbo diesel will be considered to be the equivalent of a 1400cc normally aspirated petrol engine.

SAFETY REQUIREMENTS: All vehicles must comply with MSA safety regulations as per 2008 MSA Yearbook section **C(c)** and all sections of **I** being specific regulations for Sprints and Hillclimbs and the relevant sections of **C(c)** as referred to in section **I**.

LOG BOOKS will be required for all Hill climb and Sprint cars unless the car is currently licensed for use on the public highway and competing at the event in a road legal conditions (**1.25**).

9. General Restrictions

Cars may be modified subject to the following:

Categories A - Standard Production Cars

No modifications are permitted unless stated below :-

Wheels up to 1" wider are permitted but must be of original diameter. Replacement shock absorbers are permitted provided that they are of the same method of operation and have the same location points as standard. Coil and leaf springs must remain as standard. Replacement brake pads of any material may be fitted but brake discs and callipers must remain as standard. The front seats only and the steering wheel may be changed. It is permitted to install an approved roll cage and replacement seat belts or safety harnesses. Apart from these items no part of the car may be modified in any way, no additional parts may be fitted and nothing discarded.

Cars must be taxed, insured and MOT tested (where necessary) and road legal in all aspects. Documentation must be produced at signing-on to verify this. Only those cars listed in the price lists of Top Gear, What Car, Autocar and Motor magazines for the year of manufacture are eligible. The only tyres that are permitted are those in "List 1A" of the MSA tyre regulation **C(e)** for this year (2008) and **R3.1.1** last year (2007).

Categories B and C - Road Going Cars

The main chassis structure, suspension configuration and the number of seats to remain as standard. No internal trim may be removed (except carpets), the back seat(s) must be complete and of the original type. The front seats may be replaced but both must remain capable of carrying a normal adult in a reasonably safe and comfortable manner.

All glass and its raising and lowering mechanism must remain as originally fitted (except windscreen, which may be replaced with one of laminated glass if not fitted as standard). Cars in Category B must not use aero screens. Cars in Category C may use aero screens.

The bonnet, doors and boot lid need not be of the original material but the silhouette above the centre line between the wheels must remain as standard. Wheel arch extensions are not permitted unless fitted as standard. The original type of cylinder block, cylinder head, gearbox casing and differential casing are to be retained and in their original position.

Cars must be taxed, insured and MOT tested (where necessary), and road legal in all aspects. Documentation must be produced at signing-on to verify this. Only those cars listed in the price lists of Top Gear, What Car, Autocar and Motor magazines for the year of manufacture are eligible for Category B.

Tyres:

Cars in Category B may only use tyres in "List 1A" of the MSA tyre regulation **C(e)** for this year (2008) and **R3.1.1** last year (2007).

Cars in Category C may use tyres in "List 1A" or "List 1B" of the MSA tyre regulation **C(e)** for this year (2008) and **R3.1.1** last year (2007), **except for those using a crossply construction.**

It is recommended that any car running on List 1B tyres should have a roll cage, in 2009 this will be mandatory.

Category D - Modified Production Saloon and Sports Cars

Production derived vehicles not complying with the requirements of Categories A, B and C. Cars must comply with MSA Year Book Regulation **I.82-I.102**. (Competitors are reminded of MSA Regulations **I.94** and **I.95** of the 2008 Year Book regarding engines and that roll cages are mandatory).

Category E – Single Seaters and Sports Libre Cars

As MSA Regulations (where applicable) except for wheels and tyres which are free.

10. Silencers: All vehicles including single seaters must be fitted with silencers at all times and these must reduce the noise produced to below the maximum quoted in **C(b).24**. An Environmental Scrutineer will be in attendance and will test all vehicles at two thirds maximum RPM - this will be carefully monitored. Any car judged to exceed the published noise limits will be excluded.
11. Competition numbers. These must be shown on both sides of the car. Numbers on cars not transported by trailer **MUST** be removed before leaving the venue. The organisers will not supply Numbers. Where a car is double entered the numbers not applicable must be completely masked, if this is not done the MSA time keepers may not give a time and in that case a rerun will not be permitted.
12. Timing: Competitors are reminded that all vehicles must be fitted with a timing strut accordance with MSA Technical Regulation **I.67**. Vehicles shall be fitted with a vertical timing strut mounted so that no other part of the vehicle may cut the beam first, even if the vehicles not square to the line. This is mandatory.
13. Starting: Cars will start singly when the preceding competitor has cleared the two way section of the course. The starting signal will be a green light. Timing will be automatic and will commence when the light beam is cut. Any competitor who makes a premature start or rolls forward into the timing beam will not be entitled to a re-run. The start line marshals cannot be expected to hold any vehicle to prevent its creeping forward.
14. Finish: The finish will be indicated by a 'FINISH' board. Timing stops when the finish light beam is cut. Competitors should slow down to 10 mph as soon as possible after the finish, and in any case before returning to the paddock area.
15. Course: The length of the course is approximately 1.1 miles, consisting of right and left hand bends and a chicane on tarmac. Each competitor will have two practice runs, two timed competition runs the better counting for an award. Time and weather permitting, a third non competitive timed run may also be given.
16. Markers: Times will be subject to a 5 second penalty for each and every course marker struck during a timed run. No time will be recorded for competitors who take the Wrong Route or put Four Wheels Off the indicated course. All course marshals will be judges of Fact in respect of penalties.
17. Practice: Competitors will have the opportunity of two timed practice runs. No convoy run will be given; competitors are expected to walk the course prior to the drivers briefing.
18. At the discretion of the organisers a driver can enter more than one car (**I.29**). A car may be entered twice by two different drivers (**A.43**).
19. No practice or tyre warming will be permitted.
20. Awards will be presented as follows:

Fastest Time of the Day	A Special Award
Fastest in each class.	First Class Award
Second Fastest in each class (min. 5 cars).	Second Class Award
Third Fastest in each class (min. 7 cars).	Third Class Award

* A first in class award will not be given in the class that contains FTD

Best Presented Car (Chosen by Scrutineers)	A Special Award
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At the discretion of the organisers, a Special Award will be presented to a HCAAC member for Best Performance.

All awards must be collected at the end of the Meeting and are perpetual.

Classes may be amalgamated at the discretion of the organisers, the minimum for each class is 3.

21. Results: Provisional results will be published as soon as possible after the final run. Protests should be in accordance with GR C(a).64. and C(d)45-59. Final Results will be mailed to all competitors, or emailed where an email address has been provided on the entry form.
22. Entries: The maximum entry for the Meeting is 100, the minimum is 60. Should the minimum figure not be reached, the organisers reserve the right to cancel the meeting, in which case refunds will be reduced by £5 to cover admin costs. Entry fees less £5 admin costs, will only be refunded upon notification to the Entries Secretary of intention to withdraw up to midday Monday 7th July.
23. The entry list opens on publication of these regulations and closes at midday Friday 4th July, or when the maximum entry has been reached, whichever is sooner.
24. The entry fee is £70.00. Cheques should be made payable to: "HCA & AC Ltd.".
