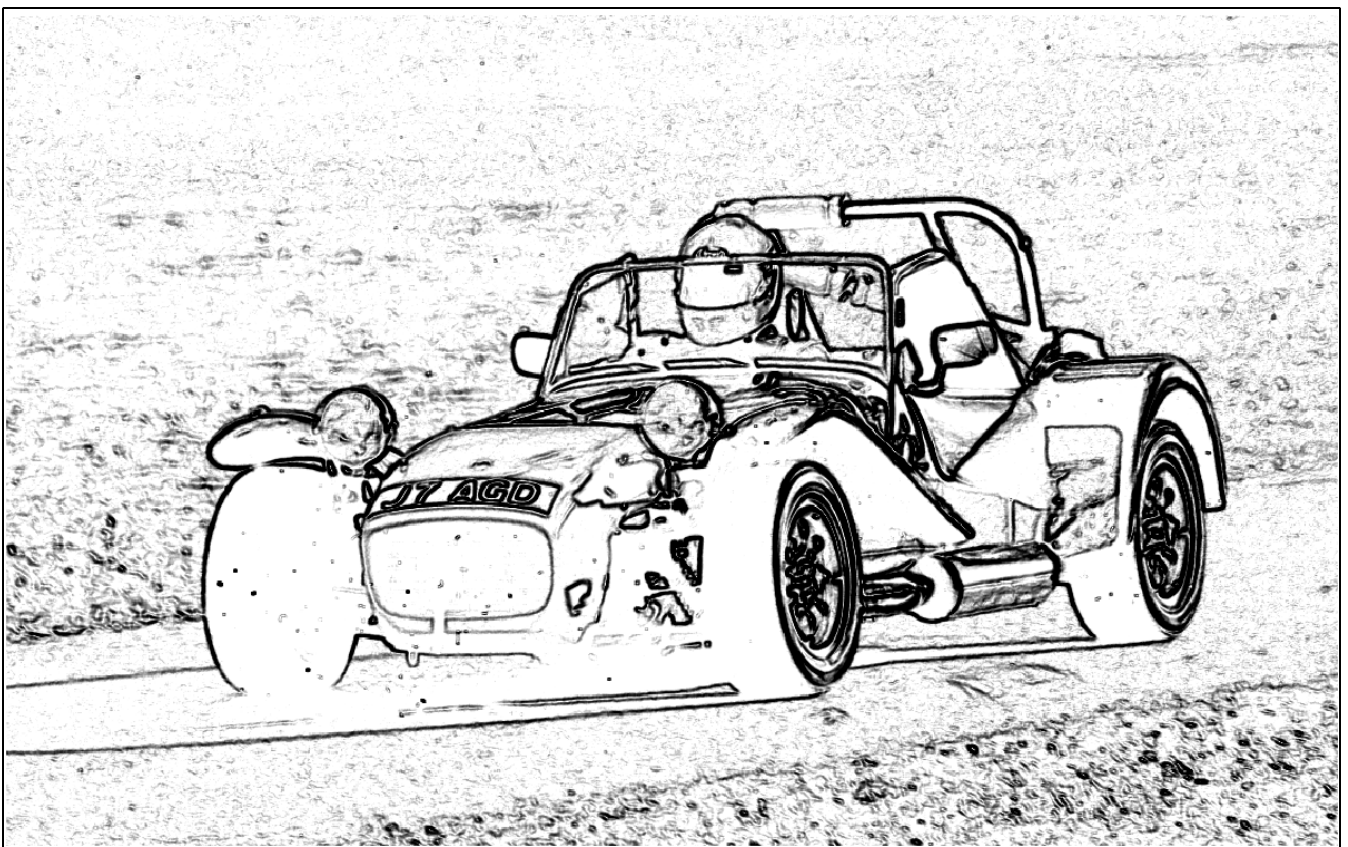

GREEN BELT MOTOR CLUB

SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

1. The Green Belt Motor Club will promote a National B permit Sprint on Sunday 27th April 2008 at North Weald Airfield, Essex.
2. The meeting will be held under the General Regulations of The Motor Sports Association (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), and these Supplementary Regulations.
3. MSA Permit Number TBA.
4. The event is open to fully elected members of the Organising Club, championship contenders in the HANGAR 111 AEMC Sprint Championship, the ASEM Speed Championship and members of clubs belonging to the following associations:-

Association of Eastern Motor Clubs, Association of South Eastern Motor Clubs and the London Counties Association of Motor Clubs.

5. All competitors and drivers must produce a valid Competition Licence, club membership card and championship registration card where appropriate.
6. The event is a qualifying round in the HANGAR 111 AEMC Sprint Championship and the ASEM Speed Championship.
7. The programme of the meeting will be:-

Scrutineering commences at	08.00
Convoy runs start at	09.30
Any competitor not signed on by	10.00 may be excluded
Practising starts at	10.00
First timed runs start at	11.00
8. The length of the course is approximately 2000m and consists of left and right hand bends on tarmac and concrete surfaces.
9. The event will contain the following categories and classes:

All vehicles must comply with MSA safety regulations as per 2008 MSA Yearbook section C(b) 7 to 26 and all sections of I being specific regulations for Sprints and Hillclimbs and the relevant sections of C(c) as referred to in section I. Competition Car Log Books will be required for all Hill climb and Sprint cars unless the car is currently taxed and insured for use on the public highway and competing at the event in a road going class (I.25).

Cars using forced induction will be classified as having an engine capacity increase of 40%; those using diesel fuel a reduction of 50% (e.g. a 2000cc turbo diesel will be considered to be equivalent of 1400cc normally aspirated petrol engine).

Cars may only be entered in their appropriate class. However the organisers reserve the right to adjust or amalgamate classes at their discretion in the interests of fair competition.

**Category A: Standard Production Cars
(Excluding 4WD and Category C Kit Type Cars and Replicas)**

0. Up to 2000cc

No modifications are permitted unless stated below:-

Wheels up to 1" wider are permitted but must be of original diameter. Replacement shock absorbers are permitted provided they are of the same method of operation and have the same location points as standard. Coil and leaf springs must remain as standard. Replacement brake pads of any material may be fitted but brake discs and calipers must remain as standard. The front seats only and the steering wheel may be changed. It is permitted to install an approved roll cage and replacement seat belts or safety harnesses. Apart from these items no part of the car may be modified in any way, no additional parts may be fitted and nothing discarded.

Cars must be taxed, insured and MOT tested (where necessary) and road legal in all aspects. Documentation must be produced at signing-on to verify this. Only those cars listed in the price lists of Top Gear, What Car, Autocar and Motor magazines for the year of manufacture are eligible. The only tyres that are permitted are those in "List 1A" of the MSA tyre regulation C(e) for this year (2008) and R3.1.1 last year (2007).

**Category B: Road Going Saloon and Sports Cars
(Excluding Kit Type Cars and Replicas)**

1. Up to 1400cc
2. 1401 to 2000cc
3. 2001cc and over

CARS MAY BE MODIFIED SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING:

The main chassis structure, suspension configuration and the number of seats to remain as standard. No internal trim may be removed (except carpets), the back seat(s) must be complete and of the original type. The front seats may be replaced but both must remain capable of carrying a normal adult in a reasonably safe and comfortable manner.

All glass and its raising and lowering mechanism must remain as originally fitted (except windscreen, which may be replaced with one of laminated glass if not fitted as standard). Aero screens are **not** allowed.

The bonnet, doors and boot lid need not be of the original material but the silhouette above the centre line between the wheels must remain as standard. Wheel extensions are not permitted unless fitted as standard. The original type of cylinder block, cylinder head, gearbox casing and differential casing are to be retained and in their original position.

Cars must be taxed, insured and MOT tested (where necessary) and road legal in all aspects. Documentation must be produced at signing-on to verify this. Only those cars listed in the price lists of Top Gear, What Car, Autocar and Motor magazines for the year of manufacture are eligible. The only tyres that are permitted are those in "List 1A" of the MSA tyre regulation C(e) for this year (2008) and R3.1.1 last year (2007).

Category C: Road Going Kit Type Cars and Replica Cars

(Including Lotus 7, Elise, Exige, Vauxhall VX220 and derivatives of these cars, Sylva, Caterham and Westfield cars)

4. Up to 1700cc
5. 1701 cc and over

CARS MAY BE MODIFIED SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING:

The main chassis structure, the suspension configuration and the number of seats to remain as standard. No internal trim may be removed (except carpets), the back seat(s) must be complete and of the original type. The front seats may be replaced but both must remain capable of carrying a normal adult in a reasonably safe and comfortable manner.

All glass and its raising and lowering mechanism must remain as originally fitted (except windscreen, which may be replaced with one of laminated glass if not fitted as standard). Aero screens **are** allowed.

The bonnet, doors and boot lid need not be of the original material but the silhouette above the centre line between the wheels must remain as standard. Wheel extensions are not permitted unless fitted as standard. The original type of cylinder block, cylinder head, gearbox casing and differential casing are to be retained and in their original position.

Cars must be taxed, insured and tested (where necessary) and road legal in all aspects. Documentation must be produced at signing-on to verify this. The only tyres that are permitted are those in "List 1A" or "List 1B" of the MSA tyre regulation C(e) for this year (2008) and R3.1.1 last year (2007), **except for those using a crossply construction**. It is recommended that any car running on List 1B tyres should have a roll cage, in 2009 this will be mandatory.

Category D: Modified Production Sports and Saloon Cars

(Excluding Kit Type Cars and Replicas, Lotus 7, Elise, Exige, Vauxhall VX 220 and derivatives of these cars, Sylva, Caterham and Westfield cars)

6. Up to 1400cc
7. 1401 to 2000cc
8. 2001cc and over

Production derived vehicles not complying with the requirements of Categories A and B. Cars must comply with MSA Yearbook Regulations I.82-102. (Competitors are reminded of MSA Regulations I.94 and I.95 of the 2008 Yearbook regarding engines). Competitors are reminded that roll cages are mandatory.

Category E: Single Seater and Sports Libre Cars

9. Special Saloons, Group B and GT1 Sports Cars, World Rally Cars, Kit Type Cars and Replicas, of any capacity, and any other cars not complying with any of the above classes.

10. Single Seater and Sports Racing Cars up to 1500cc
11. Single Seater and Sports Racing Cars 1501cc and over

As MSA Regulations (where applicable) except for wheels and tyres which are free.

LICENCES – To compete in a Single Seater Racing or Sports Libre Car, manufactured after 31/12/1960 of more than 2000cc, the driver must hold a Speed National A [OPEN] or Race National A licence unless the car is currently licensed for use on the public highway, in accordance with I.20. Sports Libre cars include Special Saloons and Sports Racing cars as in I.123.

10. **AWARDS** will be presented as follows:

No competitor may win more than one award. Any additional awards may be specified in the Final Instructions. To qualify for the Best Green Belt MC award a competitor must have been a fully paid up member of the Green Belt Motor Club before 1st April 2008.

11. The entry list opens on publication of these regulations and closes finally on Monday 21st April 2008.

The entry fee is £60.00, £53.00 for Green Belt members, and all entries must be made on the official Entry Form enclosed and accompanied by the appropriate fees. Cheques should be made payable to the **GREEN BELT MOTOR CLUB**.

The maximum entry for the meeting is 75 plus 10 reserves and the minimum is 40. Should the minimum figure not be reached, the organisers reserve the right to cancel the meeting. Entries will be selected on a first come first served basis. Entry fees may be refunded upon notification to the Entries Secretary of the intention of withdrawal not less than seven days prior to the meeting. Should the event be cancelled for any reason whatsoever, the organisers reserve the right to retain £5 of the entry fee to cover administration costs.

13. Provisional results will be published as soon after the final run as possible. Protest must be made in accordance with C(d) 45-50. Final results may be available at the conclusion of the event; if not, they will be despatched to all competitors within 14 days.

15. Identification numbers must be shown on BOTH SIDES of the car, I 30.
16. All other General Regulations of the MSA apply as written except for the following which are modified:
- I 29 A driver may only be permitted a maximum of two entries and these must be in different classes. The same car may not be entered to compete for the same award more than twice, and then only provided it is driven by different drivers.
 - I 41 The number of runs will be determined on the day, the fastest run to count for the results
 - I 43 A penalty of 5 seconds will be applied for striking a course penalty marker
17. Cars will start singly. The starting signal will be a GREEN light. Timing will be automatic and activated by light beam. The attention of competitors in all classes is particularly drawn to I 67. Any vehicle not fitted with a timing strut in accordance with this regulation WILL NOT BE TIMED. The finish line will be indicated by a FINISH board and a CHEQUERED flag.
18. Practice - Competitors will have the opportunity of a convoy run and a timed run.
19. SPECTATORS and DOGS are NOT ALLOWED at this meeting.
20. Final instructions, competition number, directions etc., will be forwarded to all competitors by post in the week prior to the meeting.
